



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

1. District Staff is working on modifications to the Santa Cruz County Floodplain and Erosion Hazard Management Ordinance #2001-03. On February 10th, the Committee moved and passed unanimously to present the current draft, along with the remaining unresolved comments, to the Board at a Study Session before the Draft and comments are taken out to the public for public meetings, review, and comment. Staff held Public Meetings and the Public Review and Comment Period. Public Meetings are scheduled for February 19 (Tubac), 26 (Patagonia/Sonoita Area), March 5 (Nogales) and 19 (Rio Rico) from 5 PM to 8 PM. Public Meetings have been postponed and will be rescheduled. The Public Review and Comment Period for the Draft Ordinance is open until the close of business on May 29, 2015. Numerous comments, approximately 18, have been received. Staff is working on organizing the comments for the committee and trying to find a date the committee can meet again.
2. During the month, the ALERT System reported precipitation ranging from 0.28 inches at the Palo Parado Bridge site to 1.02 inches at the Calabasas site.
3. For 2015, the ALERT System reported precipitation totals ranging from 9.53 inches at Red Mountain to 20.75 inches at the Peck Canyon Site. NOTE total at Palo Parado is low as gauge did not exist for all of 2015.
4. In the first week of January, Staff will be assisting ADWR and its contractor, JE Fuller Hydrology and Geomorphology, in installing and setting up a new precipitation and stream gauge where State Route 82 crosses the Santa Cruz River.
5. District Staff has started a feasibility study to look into the possibility of creating a retention/detention structure upstream of Interstate 19 in the hopes of decreasing the floodplain downstream of I-10 along Western Avenue. Initial indications are that the project is going to be feasible and may cost less than initially assumed. Staff has evaluated the possible alternatives, and decided to move to an alternative that will satisfy ADWR's concerns. The Arizona Division of Emergency Management (ADEM) informed Staff of some grant opportunities (Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant and Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant) that became open. Staff prepared and submitted a Notice of Intent to Submit to ADEM for determination of eligibility for the Ephraim Canyon Basin Project. Staff prepared and submitted an eGrants application for Flood Mitigation Assistance to finish the design and construct the Ephraim Canyon Basin. Staff has been informed the project was not accepted.

Staff will continue to seek other funding opportunities. Staff has received and commented on the Final Draft of the Feasibility Report for the Project.

6. It was brought to the attention of District Staff that a portion of the bank protections built back in 2001-2002 have partially failed. Staff is working to evaluate and make repairs. Staff may bring forward recommendations for a long term plan for improvements at a later date. Staff has meet with the engineering firm that designed the protection and they are currently evaluating what may have been the cause of the failure and are helping to look for funds for repair. Staff, with the assistance of the original engineering firm, has prepared and submitted Notices of Intent for the PDM and FMA Grants for the repair work that is needed. Staff has prepared and submitted eGrants Application to fund the repairs and mitigation needed to repair and strengthen the bank protection. Staff has been informed that the project was not accepted.
7. District Staff received no (0) Site Review Applications. For 2015, the District received 49 Site Review Applications, 15 were from the City of Nogales.
8. District Staff received eight (8) Floodplain Use Permit applications. Three (3) of the applications were located within the City of Nogales. For 2015, the District received 97 Floodplain Use Permit applications, 40 were from the City of Nogales
9. District Staff reviewed the floodplain status of seventy-four (74) properties during the past month. One (1) of the properties was located within the City of Nogales. None (0) of the properties were located in the Town of Patagonia. For 2015, the District reviewed the status of 2,173 properties, 400 within the City of Nogales, 74 within the Town of Patagonia.
10. District Staff received two (2) drainage complaint. None (0) of the complaints was from the City of Nogales. For 2015, the District received 17 complaints, one was from the City of Nogales.
11. The Town of Patagonia had no report when this report was compiled.
12. The City of Nogales had no report when this report was compiled.






BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUCSON, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The IGA between the City and Santa Cruz County for the incarceration of City Prisoners for FY16, attached hereto as Exhibit A, is approved.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the said IGA for and on behalf of the City and the City Clerk is directed to attest the same.

SECTION 3. The various City officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Resolution.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City that this Resolution become immediately

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
SANTA CRUZ COUNTY AND THE CITY OF TUCSON
FOR INCARCERATION OF MUNICIPAL PRISONERS**

This Intergovernmental Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") for the period of December 1, 2015, through November 30, 2016, is entered into pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-952 by and between the City of Tucson (hereinafter "City"), a body politic and corporate of the State of Arizona and Santa Cruz County, (hereinafter "County") a political subdivision of the State of Arizona.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into an agreement with the County for the incarceration of municipal prisoners sentenced by the Tucson City Court for ten (10) days or more; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-441 A(5), the County Sheriff has authority to take charge of and keep the County jail, and the prisoners in the County jail; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County may contract for services and enter into agreements with one another for joint and cooperative action pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-951.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Tucson and Santa Cruz County, pursuant to the above and in consideration of the matters set forth herein, do mutually agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1.0 Purpose. The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions under which City's prisoners shall be incarcerated in the Santa Cruz County Jail.

2.0 Term/Effective Date. This Agreement is effective for one (1) year from January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2016. The Parties shall have the option to extend this Agreement for up to four (4) additional one (1) year periods or any portion thereof. Any modification, termination, or extension shall be made by formal written amendment executed by the Parties.

3.0 Scope of Services.

3.1 County shall receive and detain City municipal prisoners sentenced to ten (10) or more days in the County jail who are medically fit to be incarcerated by County. County shall provide booking services and after booking provide for the care, and feeding of said prisoners. County shall provide basic medical care which can be provided in the facility by medical staff. Any medical services which cannot be provided within the jail facility will be provided by outside contractors and City will be responsible to pay for the cost of the medical services, transportation and personnel time associated with the medical care. County will provide medical bills, transportation bills and personnel bills to City for verification and payment.

If an inmate needs to be hospitalized then City will be contacted to take custody of inmate.

- 3.2 Individuals who are out of custody at the time of sentencing shall be responsible for their transportation to and from Santa Cruz County Jail, unless the City Court orders the City to provide transportation to and/or from Santa Cruz County Jail.

4.0 Payment.

- 4.1 City shall pay \$65.00 for each day or partial day of incarceration.
- 4.2 County will bill City for prisoner incarceration charges on a monthly basis. County will provide a statement that includes prisoner names in alphabetical order, booking dates and release dates for each prisoner, total billing days and the total bill. City shall be allowed reasonable access to billing systems to verify charges.
- 4.3 Neither Party shall be obligated to the other for any costs incurred pursuant to this IGA except as provided herein.

- 5.0 **Legal Jurisdiction.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as either limiting or extending the legal jurisdiction of the City or the County. This Agreement and all obligations upon the City or County arising therefrom shall be subject to any limitations of budget law or other applicable local law or regulations.

- 6.0 **Termination.** Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the other party not less than two (2) months prior to the termination date. In the event of termination, each party shall be liable for its proportionate share of the costs and expenses incurred or arising out of performance of activities required by this Agreement occurring prior to the termination date. Termination of this Agreement shall not relieve either party from liabilities or costs already incurred under this Agreement.

- 7.0 **Non-Appropriation.** Notwithstanding any other provision in this IGA, this IGA may be terminated if for any reason the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors or the City of Tucson Mayor and Council do not appropriate sufficient monies for the purpose of maintaining this IGA. In the event of such cancellation, the terminating party shall have no further obligation to the other party other than for payment for services rendered prior to cancellation.

- 8.0 **Assignment of Rights.** Neither party to this Agreement shall assign its rights under this Agreement to any other party without written permission from the other party to this Agreement.

9.0 Construction of Agreement.

- 9.1 Construction and interpretation. All provisions of this Agreement shall be construed to be consistent with the intention of the parties as expressed in the Recitals hereof.

- 9.2 Captions and headings. The headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not intended to affect the meaning of any provision of this Agreement.
- 10.0 **Conflict of Interest.** This Agreement is subject to the provisions of A.R.S. § 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference.
- 11.0 **Severability.** In the event that any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof is declared invalid or void by statute or judicial decision, such action shall have no effect on other provisions and their application, which can be given effect without the invalid or void provision or application, and to this extent the provisions of the Agreement are severable. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid or void, the parties agree to meet promptly upon request of the other party in an attempt to reach an agreement on a substitute provision.
- 12.0 **No Joint Venture.** It is not intended by this Agreement to, and nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to, create any partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the parties or create any employer-employee relationship between the City and any County employees or between the County and any City employees. Neither party shall be liable for any debts, accounts, obligations nor other liabilities whatsoever of the other, including (without limitation) the other party's obligation to withhold Social Security and income taxes for itself or any of its employees.
- 13.0 **No Third Party Beneficiaries.** Nothing in the provisions of this Agreement is intended to create duties or obligations to or rights in third parties not parties to this Agreement or affect the legal liability of either party to the Agreement by imposing any standard of care different from the standard of care imposed by law.
- 14.0 **Compliance with Laws.** The parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards, and executive orders, without limitation to those designated within this Agreement.
- 14.1 Anti-Discrimination. The provisions of A.R.S. § 41-1463, Executive Order Number 2009-09 issued by the Governor of the State of Arizona, and Tucson City Code Section 28-138 are incorporated by this reference as a part of this Agreement.
- 14.2 Americans with Disabilities Act. This Agreement is subject to all applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101-12213) and all applicable federal regulations under the Act, including 28 CFR Parts 35 and 36.
- 15.0 **Workers' Compensation.** An employee of either party shall be deemed to be an "employee" of both public agencies, while performing pursuant to this Agreement, for purposes of A.R.S. § 23-1022 and the Arizona Workers' Compensation laws. The primary employer shall be solely liable for any workers' compensation benefits, which may accrue. Each party shall post a notice pursuant to the provisions of A.R.S. § 23-906 in substantially the following form:

15.1 All employees are hereby further notified that they may be required to work under the jurisdiction or control or within the jurisdictional boundaries of another public agency, pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement or contract, and under such circumstances they are deemed by the laws of Arizona to be employees of both public agencies for the purposes of workers' compensation.

16.0 Non-Waiver. The failure of either Party to insist upon the complete performance of any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement to be performed on the part of the other, or to take any action permitted as a result thereof, shall not constitute a waiver or relinquishment of the right to insist upon full and complete performance of the same, or any other covenant or condition, either in the past or in the future. The acceptance by either Party of sums less than may be due and owing it at any time shall not constitute an accord and satisfaction.

17.0 Force Majeure. A party shall not be in default under this Agreement if it does not fulfill any of its obligations under this Agreement because it is prevented or delayed in doing so by reason of uncontrollable forces. The term "uncontrollable forces" shall mean, for the purpose of this Agreement, any cause beyond the control of the party affected, including but not limited to, failure of facilities, breakage or accident to machinery or transmission facilities, weather conditions, flood, earthquake, lightning, fire, epidemic, war, riot, civil disturbance, sabotage, strike, lockout, labor dispute, boycott, material or energy shortage, casualty loss, acts of God, or action or non-action by governmental bodies in approving or failing to act upon applications for approvals or permits which are not due to the negligence or willful action of the parties, order of any government officer or court (excluding orders promulgated by the parties themselves), and declared local, state, or national emergency, which, by exercise of due diligence and foresight, such party could not reasonably have been expected to avoid. Either party rendered unable to fulfill any obligations by reason of uncontrollable forces shall exercise due diligence to remove such inability with all reasonable dispatch.

18.0 Notification. All notices or demands upon any party to this Agreement shall be in writing, unless other forms are designated elsewhere, and shall be delivered in person or sent by mail addressed as follows:

19.0 Remedies. Either party may pursue any remedies provided by law for the breach of this Agreement. No right or remedy is intended to be exclusive of any other right or remedy and each shall be cumulative and in addition to any other right or remedy existing at law or in equity or by virtue of this Agreement.

- 20.0 Insurance.** Insurance requirements are met through self insurance pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 11-261 and 11-981 or participation in an insurance risk pool under A.R.S. § 11.952.01 Parties to this agreement shall provide thirty (30) days written notice to all other parties of cancellation, non-renewal or material change of coverage.
- 21.0 Indemnification.** Each party (as “indemnitor”) agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, the other party (as “indemnitee”) from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney’s fees) (hereinafter collectively referred to as “claims”) arising out of the bodily injury of any person (including death) or property damage, but only to the extent that such claims, which result in vicarious/derivative liability to the indemnitee, and are caused by the act, omission, negligence, misconduct, or other fault of the indemnitor, its officers, officials, agents, employees or volunteers.
- 22.0 Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. The signature pages from one or more counterpart may be removed from such counterpart and attached to a single instrument.
- 23.0 Entire agreement.** This instrument constitutes the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof, and all prior or contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral or written, are hereby superseded and merged herein. Any exhibits to this Agreement are incorporated herein by this reference.





Recommendation:

Waive the freeze to allow the Superior Court to hire a Judicial Assistant to replace the vacancy that will be left by Norma DeLaOssa, and to allow an early start date of January 19, 2016 for the purpose of cross training.

Background:

The Judicial Assistant position in Division II (office of Judge Montoya-Paez) will become vacant on February 20, 2016 following the retirement of existing Judicial Assistant, Norma DeLaOssa, and it is necessary to hire her replacement in advance of her departure for the purpose of training. Judge Paez's court calendar is already full for trials in addition to day to day hearings immediately following the scheduled retirement, and so the new Judicial Assistant must be in place to train. The expected start date for the new JA will be January 19, 2016.

Financial Implications:

This Judicial Assistant position is funded in the Court's budget in the County General fund and new dollars needed for the two pay period overlap has been tentatively approved by the County Manager.

Proposed Motion:

Mr. Chairman, I move to waive the hiring freeze for the Superior Court to hire a Judicial Assistant effective January 19, 2016 to fill a vacancy expected to occur on February 19, 2016.
