

**RESOLUTION NO. FCD2016-01
COMMITMENT OF LOCAL LEVERAGED FUNDS/RESOURCES**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTOR OF THE SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT (HEREINAFTER THE "BOARD") COMMITTING LOCAL FUNDS AS LEVERAGE FOR FY 2015-16 COLONIAS SET-ASIDE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors will adopt Resolution Number 2016-09 which authorizes submission of an application to the State of Arizona, Department of Housing (ADOH) for FY 2015/2016 Colonias Set-Aside Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds; and

WHEREAS, that application indicates that monies will be committed to Nogalitos Wastewater Drainage Improvement Project, as leveraged funds, in the form of Flood Control District funding to be used to implement the following sub-activities:

- Engineer/Design Work – \$97,122

WHEREAS, the CDBG Program requires that all local leveraged funds/resources be committed in the form of a resolution by the governing body, and that such a commitment contain an opinion by the applicant's legal counsel that the leveraged funds represent a binding commitment, legally enforceable under State laws,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby commits not-to-exceed \$97,112 to the CDBG Program, to be used for engineering and design sub-activities for the Nogalitos Wastewater Drainage Improvement Project, contingent upon the receipt of the FY 2015/2016 CDBG assistance; and that the Board hereby states that this commitment is legally binding based on the legal opinion of the County Attorney, and that such funds will be available for an audit at the termination of the grant, if so required by ADOH.

AUTHORIZATION TO SUBMIT APPLICATION AND IMPLEMENT CDBG PROJECT

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR FY 2015/2016 STATE COLONIAS SET-ASIDE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS, CERTIFYING THAT SAID APPLICATION MEETS THE COMMUNITY'S PREVIOUSLY IDENTIFIED HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS AND THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE STATE CDBG PROGRAM, AND AUTHORIZING ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND COMPLETE THE ACTIVITY OUTLINED IN SAID APPLICATION.

WHEREAS, the County of Santa Cruz is desirous of undertaking community development activities; and
WHEREAS, the State of Arizona is administering the Community Development Block Grant Program; and
WHEREAS, the State CDBG Program requires that CDBG funds requested address one of the three Congressional mandated National Objectives; and

WHEREAS, the activities within this application addresses the community's identified housing and community development needs, including the needs of low and moderate income persons; and

WHEREAS, an Applicant of State CDBG funds is required to comply with the program guidelines and Federal Statutes and regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz authorizes an application to be made to the State of Arizona, Department of Housing for FY2015/2016 Colonias Set-Aside CDBG funds, and authorizes the Chairman of the Board to sign the application and contract or grant documents for receipt and use of these funds for:

- Nogalitos Wastewater Drainage Improvements

and to take all actions necessary to implement and complete the activity submitted in said application; and

Background: In 2015 The Arizona Department of Homeland Security via the State Home Security Grant Program (SHSGP) entered into an agreement with Santa Cruz County to improve the Arizona Interoperability Radio System (AIRS.) We were awarded \$72,011 to improve the Department of Public Safety owned and operated system in an effort to improve inter-operable radio service within the County. Due to technical problems, we were not able to make the improvements to the AIRS system.

As Santa Cruz County owns and operates the ES Radio Channel for inter-operability, the Office of Emergency Management requested a grant modification and extension to apply these 2015 funds to a larger 2016 grant proposal. Attached is the AZDOHS approved Amendment #1 moving the grant termination date from September 30, 2016 to September 30, 2017

At this point in time, the 2016 grant proposal has been approved by the AZDOHS Regional Advisory Council and we are awaiting an award of \$256,989.00 for the ES Inter-operability upgrade project. Combined with this 2015 Sub-recipient Agreement Amendment the total award will be \$329,000

We have selected a vendor on the State Approved list and have conducted the engineering study for the system improvement. Projected radio coverage will

increase from approximately 17% to 93% and all County emergency providers including USBP will be able to access inter-operable radio channel.

Recommendation: The Director of Emergency Management recommends that Sub-recipient Agreement Amendment #1 15-AZDOHS-HSGP-150406-01 between the Arizona Department of Homeland Security and Santa Cruz County Emergency Management be approved.

Financial Implications: This is a fully funded AZDOHS grant without a required County share or match. There are no financial implications for Santa Cruz County.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR PLACEMENT OF A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER AT DESERT SHADOWS MIDDLE SCHOOL

This Intergovernmental Agreement (“Agreement”) entered into by and between **SANTA CRUZ COUNTY**, a political subdivision of the State of Arizona and **NOGALES UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1 OF SANTA CRUZ COUNTY**, an Arizona Unified School District (“School District”).

Authority

The County and School District are together permitted to enter into agreements for joint or cooperative action by direct contract or agreement by A.R.S. §11-952. The School District may enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with another governing body pursuant to A.R.S. §15-342 (13).

Duration

The term of this Agreement shall be for the 2016-2017 school year and shall commence on August 10, 2016, and terminate on May 26, 2017.

Purpose

- a. The purpose of this agreement is to provide the placement of one (1) School Resource Officer on the Desert Shadows Middle School campus for a period of nine (9) months. This placement is for the purpose of providing appropriate law enforcement guidance to the student body, as well as furnishing aid to the administration, staff and faculty during emergency situations, or situations involving a violation of local, state or federal statutes.
- b. The duties and objectives of such position shall be defined as follows:
 - To promote an atmosphere of safety for students and faculty members through the deterrence of criminal activity.
 - To promote instruction for classes concerning the criminal justice system or related fields.
 - To be a resource for school personnel by maintaining an open line of communication and developing a solid working relationship with school faculty, guidance counselors and administration.
 - To work in conjunction with school principals, meeting at least a minimum of once a week.
 - To provide a program of educational leadership for the students, parents and faculty addressing tobacco, alcohol and other drug issues; gang activity; violence reduction

and prevention issues; crime prevention; and safety issues in the school environment.

- To act as a communication liaison with law enforcement agencies and to provide basic Information concerning students and illegal activities.
- To gather intelligence regarding potential problems, criminal activity, gang affiliations and students unrest and identify particular individuals who may be a disruptive influence to the school and the student body.
- To take appropriate action when a crime is committed, consistent with law enforcement procedures.
- To refer students and parents to appropriate agencies and programs when intervention is required.
- To refrain from functioning as a school disciplinarian.
- To be available for student/parent and faculty conferences and to assist with concerns directly related to law enforcements and crime prevention.
- To develop strategies, in conjunction with school administration, to prevent or minimize dangerous situations within the school campus to develop and implement a school emergency response plan in coordination with the Santa Cruz Sheriff Department and to utilize mock training and drills.
- To encourage citizen awareness of law enforcement efforts in the school environment and to promote peaceful operation for school related programs and build positive support within the student body.
- To investigate cases and file police reports as required by the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office.
- To remain fully responsive to the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office chain of command in all matters pertaining to employment.
- To abide by all Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office and school policies and to coordinate special activities through the principals and the immediate supervisor(s) at the Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department.
- School Resource Officer will not routinely be available on days when students are not attending classes, unless otherwise approved by the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's office.

Supervision

- a. The Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department shall have authority over the actions, schedules and deployment of the School Resource Officer.
- b. The Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department will coordinate any and all activities and special assignments in conjunction with the School District, except in emergency situations when time and protection of life is of the essence. An emergency situation is defined as any event, which threatens human life and safety or whenever the School Resource Officer has probable cause to believe a crime is being or about to be committed.
- c. The School Resource Officer may participate in specialized educational programs in accordance with Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department standard operating procedures and at the request of the School District.
- d. While engaging in activities related to counseling or guidance, the School Resource Officer shall follow all School District administrative directives and procedures, as well as the Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department rules and regulations.

Financing

The School District shall reimburse and provide the salary, the benefits, and all employee related expenses of one (1) School Resource Officer in an amount not to exceed \$50,976.00 for the term of this Agreement. Said amount shall be billed by Santa Cruz County and paid by the School District on a bi-weekly basis.

Office Space

The School District shall provide the School Resource Officers with appropriate office space and accessories at all times during the term of this Agreement.

Insurance

The Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department and the School District each agree to obtain and maintain throughout the duration of this Agreement, public liability insurance, in the case of the School District, self-insurance provided through the coverage of the Arizona School Risk Retention Trust, specifically naming the other as an insured, in an amount mutually agreed upon by the parties to be adequate, to insure each for any reasonably foreseeable risk together party as a result of the presence of the school resource officers at School District facilities.

Conflict of Interest

If either party in this agreement desires to terminate this agreement before the natural date of expiration, it may do so without fault or liability by giving fifteen (15) days written notice of

termination to the other party. This contract is subject to cancellation by provision of law pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511, as amended, the provisions of which are incorporated herein.

E-Verify

To the extent applicable under A.R.S. §41-4401, each party and its respective subcontractors warrant compliance with all federal immigration laws and regulations that relate to its employees and compliance with the E-verify requirements under A.R.S. §23-214(A). Each party has the right to inspect the papers of the other party or its subcontractors participating in this Agreement to ensure compliance with this paragraph. A party's or its subcontractors' breach of the above-mentioned warranty shall be deemed a material breach of the Agreement and may result in the termination of the Agreement by a non-breaching party under the terms of this Agreement.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board approve the Intergovernmental Agreement for use of Santa Cruz County equipment with Nogales Unified School District #1 (NUSD) from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

Background:

In meeting with NUSD, one of the needs they identified was the ability to “rent” the County’s heavy equipment on occasion. Currently when they rent heavy equipment through a private company, it is almost cost prohibited. Using the current FEMA equipment rates, the County can generate revenue while providing a service to the School District. We have done a similar agreement in the past with NUSD with outstanding results and just entered into the same agreement with Santa Cruz Valley Unified #35. The proposed agreement before you is valid for one year and is based on the availability of the County’s equipment and labor.

Financial Implications:

Revenue will be generated within the Road, Flood, or Landfill funds based on usage by NUSD and which fund owns the equipment being “rented.”

Proposed Motion:

Move to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement for use of Santa Cruz County equipment by the NUSD from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
FOR USE OF FACILITIES

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between Santa Cruz County, a political subdivision of the State of Arizona (“County”) and the Nogales Unified School District No. 1, a political subdivision of the State of Arizona (“School District”). The County and School District agree as follows:

1. **Purpose:** The purpose of this agreement is to allow Santa Cruz County and Nogales Unified School District No. 1 to utilize facilities owned and maintained by each respectively for the benefit of the entities and the community at large.
2. **Authority:** The County and School District are authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. §11-952. The School District is also authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. §15-342(13).
3. **Duration:** The term of this Agreement shall be for the 2016-2017 school year, commencing July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017. This Agreement may be renewed for four (4) additional one year terms by agreement of the parties.
4. **Responsibilities:**
 - 4.1 **County Responsibilities:** Pursuant to the terms of this Agreement School District upon approval and availability may use the following facilities owned and operated by the County during the duration of this Agreement:

- 4.2 **School District Responsibilities:** Pursuant to the terms of this Agreement County upon approval and availability may use the following facilities owned and operated by the School District during the duration of this Agreement:

List facilities

5. **Use of Facilities:**
 - 5.1 The County may use School District facilities from time to time during the school year, and at other times and dates mutually agreeable to the parties, providing the activity is compatible with school use and/or activities which shall be determined at the discretion of the Superintendent or his designee. The School District will provide the County with a list of individuals to contact in connection with use requests, and shall periodically provide the County with lists of scheduled events which may interfere with planned County use of School District facilities.

- 5.2 The School District may use County facilities from time to time during the school year, and at other times and dates mutually agreeable to the parties, providing the activity is compatible with school use and/or activities which shall be determined at the discretion of the Superintendent or his designee. The County will provide the School District with a list of individuals to contact in connection with use requests, and shall periodically provide the School District with lists of scheduled events which may interfere with planned School District use of County facilities.
 - 5.3 School District shall be responsible for any additional costs associated with the event (such as portable toilets) while County is providing its facilities to School District. The School District will reimburse the County for after event cleaning, up to \$300 per event.
 - 5.4 County shall be responsible for any additional costs associated with the event (such as portable toilets) while School District is providing its facilities to County. The County will reimburse the School District for after event cleaning, up to \$300 per event.
 - 5.5 Each party shall provide adequate supervision and security while making use of the other party's facilities.
6. **Financing:** Parties represent and warrant that they have sufficient funds available in their budgets to meet their respective obligations imposed by this agreement.
 7. **Termination:**
 - 7.1 If either party to this Agreement desires to terminate this Agreement before it expires on its own terms, it may do so without fault or liability by giving thirty (30) days written notice of termination to the other party as long as there are no events/use scheduled by either party.
 - 7.2 This Agreement may be terminated for conflict of interest pursuant to A.R.S. §38-511.
 - 7.3 Parties agree that in the event they continue to operate pursuant to this agreement after the term set forth in Section 3 has expired then the continuation shall be upon the same terms and conditions set forth in this agreement.
 - 7.4 This Agreement is a lease only, and upon termination of this Agreement for any reason each party shall retain its own facilities and shall have no claim to any of the facilities of the other party.

8. **Indemnification:**

8.1 County agrees, to the extent permitted by law to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the School District from and against all liability, damages, costs and expenses from causes of action, suits, claims, demands, and judgments of any nature or kind whatever arising out of or in any way connected with the County's use of the School District's facilities pursuant to this agreement.

8.2 School District agrees, to the extent permitted by law to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the School District from and against all liability, damages, costs and expenses from causes of action, suits, claims, demands, and judgments of any nature or kind whatever arising out of or in any way connected with the School District's use of the County's facilities pursuant to this agreement.

9. **Miscellaneous Provisions:**

9.1 The County and School District each agree to obtain and maintain throughout the duration of this Agreement public liability insurance, specifically naming the other as an insured, in an amount mutually agreed to by the parties as adequate to insure each for any reasonably foreseeable risk to either party, covering each party's use and operation of the facilities referred to in this Agreement.

9.2 Each party agrees to advise the other party if problems with any particular use of a facility result in excess cost or damage to the facility, so that remediation of the problem may be undertaken by the party responsible for the use in question.

10. **Effective Date:** This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by both parties.

11. **Records:** Both parties shall maintain all records related to this Agreement for a period of two years after the termination of this Agreement.

12. **Entire Agreement:** This Agreement comprises the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any and all other agreements or understandings, oral and written, whether previous to the execution hereof or contemporaneous herewith. Any amendments or modifications to this Agreement shall be made only in writing and signed by the parties to the Agreement.

13. **Severability and Savings:** If any part of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, such holding will not affect the validity or enforceability of any other part of this agreement so long as the remainder of the Agreement is reasonably capable of completion without inequity to the parties.

14. **Applicable Law:** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona.
