SUBJECT: Approval to transfer monies from General Fund to cover negative cash balances at June 30, 2020 and authorize the Administrative Services Director to transfer any additional monies needed to cover negative cash at year-end.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board approve the following transfer in/out, due to/from the General Fund to cover negative cash balances and allow the Administrative Services Director to transfer any other amounts necessary due to cover negative cash or close out grant funds at June 30, 2020.

BACKGROUND:

For proper financial statement presentation and in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, we do not show negative cash balances in any fund at fiscal year-end. As a result, I am requesting the Board's approval to transfer the monies listed to cover all negative cash at June 30th. I am requesting any additional amounts because we do not know our actual June 30th cash balance until we close the fiscal year (Tuesday, June 30th). Therefore, any changes between Monday (when the report was created) and Friday could result in a change in cash balance. In addition, to the balances we have listed here, we have expenses that will be posted that is not accounted for in these amounts.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The General Fund cash balance will decrease by approximately \$ 2,099,282 million.

PROPOSED MOTION:

Move to approve the transfer in/out, due to/from the General Fund, as listed, to cover negative cash balances at June 30th and authorize the Administrative Services Director to transfer any additional monies needed to cover negative cash balances and close out grant funds.



STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System pension funding policy in accordance with Arizona Revised Statute § 38-863.01.

BACKGROUND:

The County shall comply with state law by annually adopting a pension funding policy that meets the criteria set forth in Arizona Revised Statute § 38-863.01. The Board of Supervisors PSPRS funded ration goal is 100% (fully funded) over a period of 18 years. The plan to achieve this goal requires full Annual Required Contributions (ARC) payments, which is the normal cost and Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability (UAAL) amortization, from operating funds over the entire amortization period of 20 years.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The amounts are budgeted from the General Fund and Jail District.

PROPOSED MOTION:

Move to approve the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System pension funding policy in accordance with Arizona Revised Statute § 38-863.01.



Public Safety Personnel Retirement System and Corrections Officers Retirement Plan Pension Funding Policy

This pension funding policy is done in accordance of ARS § 38-863.01. The following terms used throughout this policy are defined as:

Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability (UAAL) – Is the difference between trust assets and the estimated future cost of pensions earned by employees.

Annual Required Contribution (ARC) – Is the annual amount required to pay into the pension funds, as determined through annual actuarial valuations. It is comprised of two primary components: normal pension cost – which is the estimated cost of pension benefits earned by employees in the current year; and, amortization of UAAL – which is the cost needed to cover the unfunded portion of pensions earned by employees in previous years. The UAAL is collected over a period of time referred to as the amortization period. The ARC is a percentage of the current payroll.

Funded Ratio – Is a ratio of fund assets to actuarial accrued liability. The higher the ratio the better funded the pension is with 100% being fully funded.

The Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors (The Board) formally accepts the assets, liabilities, and current funding ratio of the County’s PSPRS trust funds, including the CORP, as reported by the PSPRS, the plan administrator, from their June 30, 2019 actuarial valuation, which is detailed below:

Consistent with the PSPRS’ Actuarial Funding Policy, the Board’s PSPRS funding ratio, goal is 100% (fully funded) over a period of 20 years*.

The plan to achieve this goal requires full ARC payments (normal cost and UAAL amortization) from operating funds over the entire amortization period of 20 years*. The estimated ARC for FY20 is \$806,689 and \$68,525 for CORP (A-2).

** Note: The plan to amortize the UAAL over an extended period of time is conditional on the accuracy of the actuarial assumptions. These assumptions are updated on an annual basis and the ARC as well as the amortization period may be adjusted.*




