Effective August 31, 2020, it is required that all attorneys, parties, witnesses, jurors, court personnel and other persons necessary to a proceeding attend in person, consistent with pre-COVID practices.

Alternatively, the judge presiding over the matter may grant a participant leave to appear remotely, pursuant to a request made in advance of the hearing, or may grant the request at the hearing, upon discretion of the court for good cause shown, and the judge on his/her initiative and with notice to the parties may order the participants to appear remotely, if good cause exists for such an order.

Persons supervised by adult and juvenile probation officers also are permitted entry consistent with pre-COVID practices, if directed by their supervising probation officer to present themselves at the probation office. Probation supervision should proceed consistent with pre-COVID practices.

Victims may choose whether to attend in person, consistent with pre-COVID practices.

The Jury Commissioner will encourage and permit prospective jurors called for jury duty to appear remotely for the jury selection process through the Zoom platform, or an alternatively designated and approved platform. The Jury Commissioner will make the determination as to whether a prospective juror is eligible for a remote appearance for jury selection based upon objective criteria such as the prospective juror's confirmed access to a reliable internet connection and possession of a computer or digital device with a camera and microphone.

Members of the public who are not participants but wish to observe court proceedings in person remain excluded consistent with existing orders of the Arizona Supreme Court. Persons subject to exclusion are directed to this court's website for information as to public access on YouTube for certain court proceedings. Exceptions may be made by the judge for good cause shown, and with coordination with Court Administration and courthouse security.

For those persons who are permitted entry, the court's security and administrative staff will continue to apply and enforce the current health screening protocols of the Administrative Office of the Courts for the Supreme Court of the State of Arizona. Persons failing the screening

Office of the Courts for the Supreme Court of the State of Arizona. Persons failing the screening protocol will be denied entry. Alternative arrangements will be made for those persons denied entry to permit them to attend their court proceeding.

Persons entering the court must wear a facial mask or covering at all times within the courthouse.

CDC social distancing guidelines will be enforced. The number of participants permitted in a courtroom will be consistent with CDC social distancing guidelines, but in no event shall exceed 30 persons.

This order is subject to revision should there be a change in community health conditions that merit further restrictions.

Administrative Order 2020-010 (Limiting Public Access to the Santa Cruz County Court for Certain Purposes) and Order 2020-011 (In re the Requirement of Electronic Superior Court Filings) remain in effect, *except* that the component of Order 2020-010 prohibiting entry by participants in civil and juvenile traffic hearings is vacated.


