Your School Counselor will:

- Teach all students values based on the Character counts Curriculum
- Serve as point of contact to work with students who need brief interventions. The work of the elementary school counselor does not substitute that of a behavioral health counselor.
- Will assist in identifying students who will require outside counseling, and follow through with the referral process.
